#### TOWN WARRANT

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Pelham in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Pilgrim Hall in said Pelham on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.
- 3. To bring in your ballots for Delegates and alternates to the National Convention for the nomination of candidates for President and Vice President of the United States.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to raise appropriate and set apart the amount of money necessary to secure State aid for permanent improvement of highways; under the law passed January session, 1905.
- 5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the repair of highways and bridges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same and determine in what manner the same shall be expended.
- 6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the extermination of Moths and Beetles.
- 7. To choose two persons for three years for trustees of Cemeteries.

- 8. To choose one person for three years and one person for two years as trustees of the Public Library.
- 9. To choose by ballot one person for three years, one person for two years, and one person for one year, as trustees of trust funds of the town.
- 10. To see bow much money the town will vote to raise in addition to the amount required by law, for the Public Library.
- 11. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for Cemeteries the ensuing year.
- 12. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the observance of Memorial Day.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to build a Town Hall building, to see how much money they will vote to raise and appropriate for the same, choose committees, or take any other action relating thereto.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount of two per cent on tax list of 1916 paid before September 1, 1916.
- 15. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
