#### TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Pelham in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Pelham on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To hear the report of the Budget Committee and act thereon.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriations of the same.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to repair and shingle the Town Hall, or take any other action relative thereto.
- 5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate, and set apart for Town Maintenance of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
- 6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Police Department for the ensuing year.
- 7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department for the ensuing year.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$240.00 for street lighting for the ensuing year or take any other action relative thereto.
- 9. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the aid of the town poor for the ensuing year.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for old age assistance for the ensuing year.
- 11. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Library in addition to the amount required by law.

- 12. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the cemeteries for the ensuing year.
- 13. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.
- 14. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay on the town debt.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the the sum of \$855.00 to pay the interest on town notes.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for construction of the Marsh Road to complete the Legislative Special 1936 appropriation, or take any other action relative thereto.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to have the construction on the Marsh Road, so-called, continue straight to junction of Bridge Street, so-called, and the Nashua Road, or across southerly side of Common to Gage Hill Road, as at present, or take any other action relative thereto.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for W. P. A. construction on the Muldoon Road, so-called, or take any other action relative thereto.
- 19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$501.76 as the town's share of .T. R. A. for construction of Class V Roads.
- z0. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$212.50 to be applied to the rental charge of \$212.50 for the purchase of a V-type snow plow as recommended by the committee appointed at last Town Meeting, or to take any other action relative thereto.
- 21. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to purchase snow fence or to take any other action relative thereto.
- 22. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for snow removal or to take any other action relative thereto.
- 23. To see if the town will vote to accept the bequest or legacy of real estate situated in the Town of Pelham, given to said town under the will of Martina A. Gage.

- 24. To see if the town, if said bequest is accepted, will authorize the Selectmen to administer said property for the benefit of the town or to lease, or sell said property either at public auction or private sale for such rental, or purchase price as in their judgment may seem best, giving to said board of Selectmen the right to appoint such agents to assist in the handling of said property as they may see fit, or to act thereon.
- 25. To see if the town will vote to authorize a twenty-five cent fine on each poll tax not paid on or before December 31, of the year of levy.
- 26. To see if the town approve the fire trucks and pumps being used for other purposes outside of fire protection.
- 27. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow necessary money in anticipation of taxes.
- 28. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$743.38 to make up deficit caused by the over-drawing of 1935 appropriations.
- 29. To see if the town will vote to have printed in the Town Report, an itemized account of labor and materials used in every department of the town and on what jobs it has been spent.
- 30. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount of 3 per cent on the 1936 tax list, paid on or before June 1, 1936; 2 per cent if paid on or before August 1,1936; 1 per cent if paid on or before October 1, 1936.
- 31. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when they make their annual appraisal in April.
- 32. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
