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*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Pelham in the  
County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to  
vote in Town Affairs: Polls open 10 A. M. to 6 P. M.*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Pelham on Tuesday, the 9th day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing, and as provided by law.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the town will vote to accept the town budget as prepared by the Budget Committee.
4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$495.03 the state to contribute \$1,980.10 as recommended by the budget committee, for town road aid.
5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 to pay on the town debt, as recommended by the budget committee.
6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,500.00 to be used with T. R. A. in improving Class V roads, as recommended by the budget committee.
7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200.00 for civilian defense, for police and health protection.
8. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when they make their annual appraisal in April.
9. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen and town treasurer to borrow necessary money in anticipation of taxes.

10. To see if the town will vote to adopt the Non-Partisan ballot as provided by law by the 1943 session of the state legislature.

11. To see if the town will vote to grant a discount on all property taxes paid in full, two per cent on or before August 1st, 1943, one per cent on or before October 1st, 1943, or take any other action relative thereto.

12. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
