To the inhabitants of the Town of Pelham qualified to vote in Town affairs

You are hereby notified to meet at Pilgrim Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects:

- 1 To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing
- 2 To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same
- 3 To see if the Town will vote to raise, appropriate and set apart the amount of money necessary to secure State aid for permament improvement fo Highways, under the law passed at January Session 1905
- 4 To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for the repair of Highways and Bridges for the year ensuing and make appropriations for the same. And to determine in what manner the same shall be expended

- 5 To see what disposition the Town will make of the Dog Fund for the ensuing year
- 6 To see what disposition the Town will make of the Literary Fund for the year ensuing
- 7 To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the extermination of Gypsy and Browntail Moths, and take any other action in relation thereto
- 8 To choose two persons for Trustees of Cemeteries for three years
- 9 To choose one person for Trustee of Public Library for three years
- 10 To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for the Public Library in addition to the amount required by law
- 11 To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for Cemeteries for the ensuing year
- 12 To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for School purposes for the year ensuing
- 13 To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for the observance of Memorial Day
- 14 To see if the Town will vote to build a Town Hall building, and if vote in the affirmative to see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the same. Also to choose agents or Committees to carry the same into effect, or take any other action relating thereto
- 15 To see if the Town will vote to select three men for the appraises of real estate for the year ensuing

- 16 To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of two per cent on Tax list of 1909 paid on or before Sept 1st 1909
- 17 To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting
